Craggan, by Ardeonaig, Loch Tay, Perthshire FK21 8SU

Craggan was constructed in 1975 as the Outdoor Centre for Edinburgh, Leith and District Battalion. The house has recently been extensively refurbished and now has full disabled access including a lift.

The site extends from the road way to the loch side with magnificent views down Loch Tay and over the majestic Ben Lawers (1214 metres). There is also a landing jetty accessible from the sand/shingle beach. The Centre is ideally situated for groups of all ages with ready access to many facilities in the locality and is well-suited for water activities, hill walking for all abilities and group holidays.

Camp Site - An additional space is available for 6 tents and can be used in conjunction with the Centre.

The Centre sleeps up to 30 people and is available to both BB groups and outside groups on a self-catering basis.

Accommodation - the main lounge/dining and kitchen area is on the 1st floor. Downstairs there are 4 staff rooms, 4 large bedrooms and a disabled room. Toilets and showers are also found on the ground floor, the entrance hall can also be used as a drying room.

The kitchen is well equipped with a double oven cooker. There is a good supply of indoor games equipment.

Outdoor Activities

A field adjacent to the Centre can be used for games. There is also ready access to the beach and its fishing rights.

12 Canoes with life jackets and helmets are available at an additional charge, groups should provide their own instructors.

Safety Boat - a "rib" type safety boat with outboard motor and two other older dinghies are also available for hire.

Wind Surfing - a wind surfing board is also available.

(Abernethy Outdoor Centre - if contacted in advance can usually provide Instructors on a session basis at a reasonable cost).

LOCATION

Craggan is situated on the south side of Loch Tay on the single track road between Killin and Kenmore adjacent to the hamlet of Ardeonaig, approximately 7 miles east of Killin.

Killin is 72 miles from Edinburgh and is reached within 2 hours via the M9 from Stirling, A84 Lochearnhead and the A85 to Killin. As you enter Killin take the minor road opposite the Falls of Dochart along the south side of Loch Tay.

Alternatively travel the M90 to Perth then the A9 to Ballinluig where you take the A827 through Aberfeldy to just short of Kenmore itself. Then take the south road of Loch Tay marked Acharn for approximately 9 miles.
